

What We Wish You Knew

Discussion Guide

This discussion guide is for the workshop **What We Wish You Knew: Issues Great Commission Workers Are Dealing with That You're Not Talking About**. The workshop is 52 minutes and after watching it, here are a few questions for you to discuss.

- 1 . Was there anything that surprised you about the percentage of people who said they have (or don't have) an issue that might jeopardize them being on the field? What was that?
- 2 . Have you heard about the pedestal and cross-cultural workers? What resonated with you about what Amy said? Do you notice this concept in a part of your sending/church/organization culture? In what ways have you inadvertently been a part of perpetuating it?
- 3 . If someone were to ask you about the relationship between humanity and stakes when it comes to cross-cultural workers, how would you explain it?
- 4 . How do you feel hearing what you've heard? Before you talk about what to do or how to help, consider the weight of what you've heard and read.
- 5 . Even if you try to be the safest sender or senders, you will probably not be the go-to person or people for some issues because of the stakes. What outside resources can you offer to those you send so that they can have more space for their humanity?
- 6 . What are one or two specific ways you can respond to what you've heard in the next few weeks? Even the next few years?
- 7 . In what ways can you be a bridge between goers and your church or others who may not fully understand what it's like for those on the field?
